Dear Sirs:

We are outraged at the recent campesino killings and other serious acts of repression listed below that have occurred since the Xatruch II (joint military-police) Operation arrived in the Bajo Aguan Region of Colon Dept.

- On August 21, **Arnoldo Portillo**, a member of the 5 de Enero Empresa Cooperativa, was found murdered by machete strikes and gunfire.
- On August 21, Pedro Salgado, the President of the 5 de Enero Cooperativa, and his wife Irene Licona, were murdered by
 machete strikes and gunfire.
- On September 2, in the exit from the Los Marañones community, **Olvin David González Godoy**, a member of the Empresa Campesina 21 de junio, was shot and killed by several gunmen.
- On September 19, during an attack on the Rigores community, **Bernabe Cruz**, 16-year-old son of the president of the Movimiento Campesino de Rigores (MCR), was taken by Xatruch forces; in detention, his captors beat him, poured gasoline on him and threatened to set him on fire:
- On September 29, **German Castro**, President of the Prieta cooperative, and his wife, **Miriam Enelda Fiallo**, were traveling in a truck when attacked with automatic gunfire. Miriam Enelda Fiallo was killed and German is in critical condition.
- On October 2, Carlos Humberto Martínez, a member of the La Lempira cooperative and the Movimiento Unificado Campesino del Aguan (MUCA), was shot to death near his fields at approximately 5 am.
- On October 4, Marco Tulio Paredes, a leader of the MUCA from the community of Rigores, was surrounded by Xatruch
 troops who attempted to kidnap and threatened to kill him. On September 15, Paredes had been cited in a New York Times
 article advocating land reform.
- On October 5, **Alfredo Matamoros**, treasurer of the La Aurora cooperative, and **Jarel Sánchez**, both members of the MUCA, were gravely wounded when their car was shot at from gunmen inside a palm plantation the men's car was passing.
- On October 6, **Walter Nelin Sabillon Yanes** of Rigores community, reported being detained and tortured with electric shocks and a plastic bag placed over his head to induce near suffocation by Xatruch forces.
- On October 11, security guards for Dinant palm oil (owned by Miguel Facusee) opened fire on campesinos working on the La
 Aurora cooperative, instantly killing campesino Santos Serfino Zelaya. In another area of the farm, guards opened fire on 15
 women, who sought refugee in the trees.

We demand that you immediately

- order the Xatruch II Operation to stop terrorizing campesinos in the Bajo Aguan region;
- order private companies not to use force against campesinos who are unarmed and working the land;
- order an open and thorough investigation into the atrocities against the campesinos listed above, make the results public, and bring those responsible to justice.
