Dear Sirs and Madams:

We are writing to express our concern for the safety of **Miriam Miranda**, Coordinator of OFRANEH, the National Black Organization of Honduras (*Organización Fraternal Negra Hondureña*), and to insist that the harassment and threats against her cease completely and immediately. The harassment and threats against her, OFRANEH and against everyone who defends freedom of expression and the right to a dignified life, are a threat to the most basic human rights. This repression is evidence that not even the most basic guarantee to exercise liberties that are fundamental for any democracy exist any longer in Honduras. Furthermore, the repression goes against existing international standards defending the rights of the indigenous and Afro-descendant communities.

We demand that Honduras guarantee absolute respect for the preventative protection measures (medidas cautelares) granted to Miriam Miranda.

Over the past few years, we have written several letters to Honduran officials asking for investigations into human rights abuses carried out against members of OFRANEH and the Garífuna community and demanding protection for them. In our most recent letter (April 5, 2011), we asked for an investigation into the unjust detention and police beating of Miriam Miranda on March 28; we are still awaiting a response regarding your investigation.

We call on our leaders and political representatives to take strong measures demanding that Honduras immediately end any and all harassment and abuse against Miriam Miranda.
